




The Laborshed survey collects information regarding the **out commute** for an employment center.

The out commute for Greenfield is estimated at 28.4 percent— approximately 348 people living in Greenfield work in other communities.

Most of those who are out commuting are working in Creston and Des Moines.

Over one-third (36.0%) of out commuters are likely to change employment (approximately 125 people).

52.0% earn an hourly wage—median wage is \$23.50/hour 48.0% earn an annual salary—median salary is \$60,000/year





UNDEREMPLOYMENT

The underemployed are working fewer than 35 hours per week but desire more hours (**inadequate hours**); in positions that do not meet their skill or education level, or have worked for higher wages at previous employment (**mismatch of skills**); or are earning wages equal to or less than the national poverty level and work 35 or more hours per week (**low income**).
